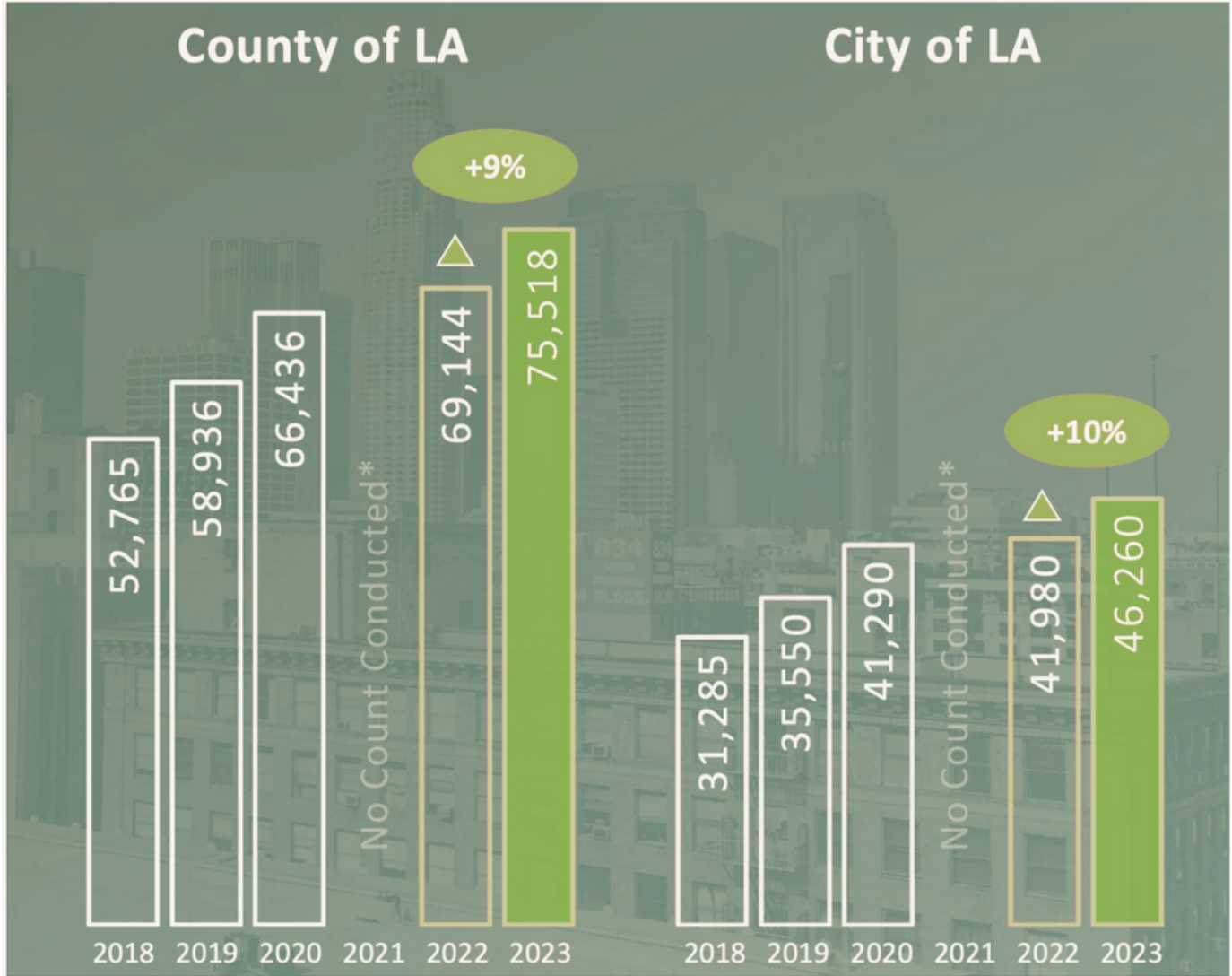

# Our History

- 1968** ● A California law released thousands of patients from state psychiatric institutions rendering many to the streets
- 1979** ● Local residents founded the Beverlywood Mental Health Center (BMHC), a residential treatment center that provided supervised housing to 120 of these patients
- 1980** ● BMHC received a contract from LA County to provide mental health treatment to onsite residents
- 1986** ● BMHC expanded to add Outpatient Services to underserved community members
- 1999** ● BMHC relocated to a larger facility to meet the growing demand for our services changing its name to the Alcott Center for Mental Health Services
- 2018** ● Alcott expanded to add Intensive Case Management Services to chronically houseless and individuals referred via the office of diversion & reentry
- 2019** ● The Covid-19 pandemic shuts down the world and becomes a major cause of economic downturn. Communities sees a rise in houselessness and requests for mental health services
- 2020** ● Alcott opened two Interim Housing sites - Fisher Place and Bandera House, both serving individuals diverted from incarceration, incompetent to stand trial
- 2022** ● Alcott added another layer of care to its services - Enhanced Care Case Management
- 2023** ● Alcott consolidated & relocated to its new location in Culver City location
- 2024** ● Coming Soon: Unarmed Crisis Response and 3rd Interim Housing Site

Results from the 2023 point-in-time homelessness count.

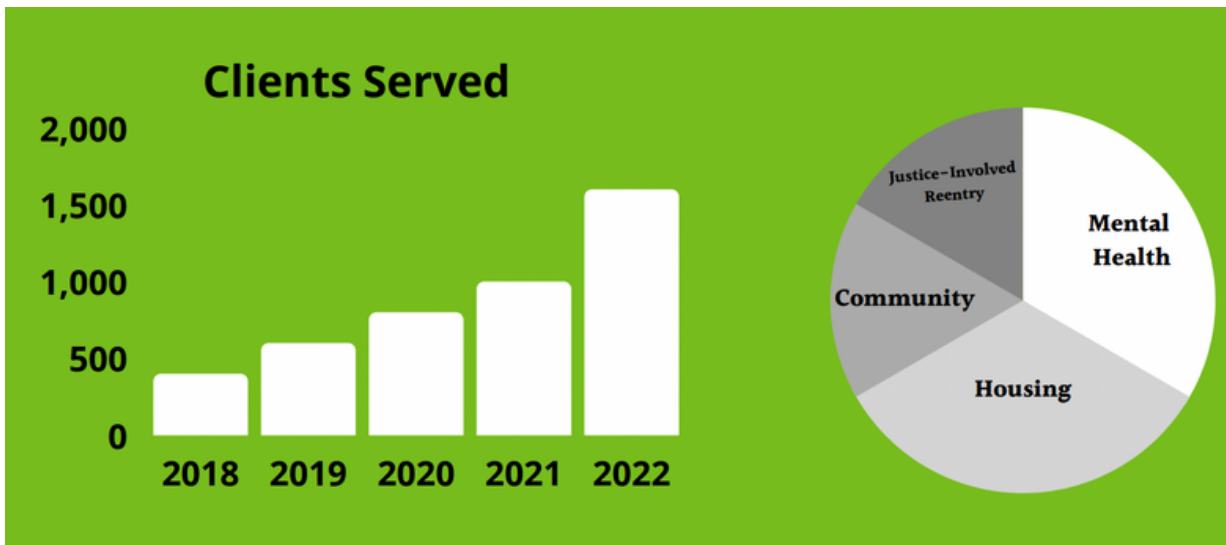

**Individuals receiving support through our programs have a higher success rate of finding housing and remaining housed**

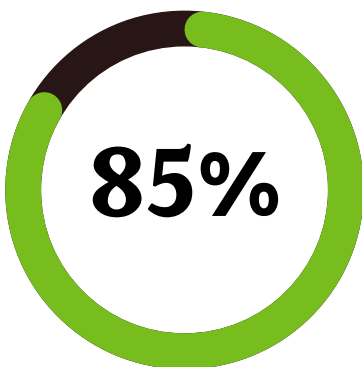

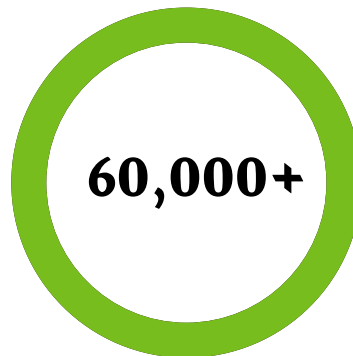

# Our Programs

## Mental Health

Outpatient individual & group therapy, psychiatry, case management and preventative services for adult community members without insurance or who are Medi-Cal beneficiaries

## Supportive Housing

Intensive case management, housing navigation, and permanent housing services for community members navigating housing & mental health challenges

## Justice Involved Re-entry

Interim housing, including mental health, nursing, life skills and substance use services, for community members navigating reentry and case management for individuals navigating justice-involved reentry & mental health challenges

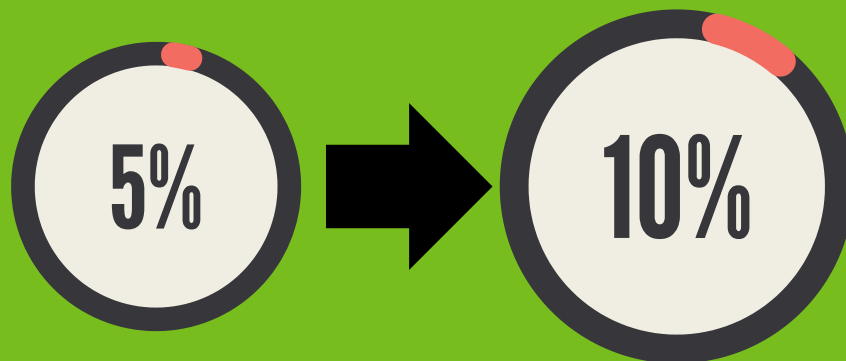
## Community

- Continue to meet the growing demand and provide our services in physical health care, substance use treatment and other services

- Increase the amount of corporate and private unrestricted funding support we receive
- As part of the national 988 effort, launch two unarmed crisis response teams
